## Pastor's Notebook

### CHANGES

At the March 17 Council meeting, Pastor Wendy announced that she intends to pursue bringing the "call message" to a wider audience through the non-profit teaching ministry organization, "Call Incorporated." She will end her current responsibilities with Hope on June 30, 2009. At this time, Call Incorporated will begin paying her full salary. She is excited about bringing the call message to more individuals and churches. **Call Inc.** is a non-profit Christian teaching mission dedicated to helping individuals discover God's unique call by providing seminars and resources to assist in custom designing a life, family, church, or organization around God's call. **Call Inc.** was formed a couple of years ago by the Hars and Berthelsens, and to date has been a spare time project. In the recent past, God has provided several teaching and financial opportunities including a formal relationship with Association of Lutheran Older Adults to teach events for retirees on an ongoing basis.

After June 30, Wendy will preach once a quarter to give Joel a break. She will continue to conduct "call" events (1-2X/year). She will assist Matt and Joel with the work of ministry development, the "call" vision, and interns when needed. She will teach the Timothy Project Bible Study.

On June 30, Matthew Cleaver will assume some of Wendy's responsibilities (half-time): Ministry Development, communication/execution of the call vision, and administration. He will continue to devote the other half of his time to the youth ministry. He will preach once a quarter. Joel will assume Wendy's pastoral responsibilities. Both Matt and Joel will continue to communicate and build the "call" vision. The Council has given their approval to hiring youth and family ministry intern(s) on an ongoing basis to assume some of Matt's youth ministry responsibilities as he devotes time towards some of Wendy's responsibilities. In addition, Matt will supervise the intern.

The bishop's office has given their support to this endeavor and its timing. One of the options given by the assistant to the bishop was for Hope to redefine Wendy's call at Hope by giving her a new title (such as Pastor of Ministry in Daily Life") while allowing her to pursue this endeavor as an extension of Hope's ministry, similar to one of Hope's missionaries. The Council will be considering this option. Regardless, her current relationship with Hope will change on June 30, and **Call Inc.** will pay her full salary.

## Sexuality Issues: August ELCA Church-wide Assembly VOTES

This summer, our August Church-wide assembly will take four votes regarding active sexual relationships that are “*lifelong, monogamous, same-gender*” relationships (pay attention to the italics). If the scriptures are crystal clear about same-gender sexual relationships, how is it that we now are going to vote on this? I think I can explain this with an illustration. Sometimes we need to illustrate absurdity with absurdity; so, if you do not understand what I am saying, read it again. It will become clear.

Here we go:

If one of the writers of “Report and Recommendation on Ministry Policies” (a proposed document for vote at the ELCA Church-wide Assembly in August) would come to your house for dinner, I suggest you count your silverware and make sure it is all there after the guest leaves. “Why?” you ask. “Because,” I answer, “the scriptures do not say anything about borrowing silverware *for the remainder of the silverware’s life*, particularly in situations where the silverware is only used at *one home*, and particularly when only silverware of the *same pattern* is used.” (lifelong, mono-homed, same-patterned)

To this you might respond, “No, the scriptures do not say all that. However, the scriptures do say, ‘You shall not steal.’ So the scriptures do not have to describe every situation that might arise, even if life-long, mono-homed, same-patterned language is used. All the scriptures need to say is, ‘You shall not steal.’ So my guest should know that taking the silverware is not right.”

To this I say, “Well, what you just said makes sense to me, but I am not sure if it makes sense to the “Report and Recommendations on Ministry Policies” writers. After all, the place they should be looking, the scriptures, has 100 % consensus with Leviticus 18:22 (“A man shall not lie with a man as a man lies with a woman...”) Nevertheless, they move ahead, even while the church is constitutionally bound to make the scriptures the norm for its life and faith, as if the clear word doesn’t exist and only emphasize that there is no consensus in the church on the issue, as if man’s opinion is more important than the scriptures. So perhaps they might think “You shall not steal” has nothing to say about the above dinner guest and silverware scenario.

Of course this dinner guest and silverware scenario is utterly absurd. Sometimes it is helpful to illustrate absurdity with absurdity. The present state of our five-year (now seven) sexuality process is equally absurd. May the Lord help us defeat these upcoming votes. See the next page for a short description of the upcoming votes.

## Summary of What Will be Voted on at the August Churchwide Assembly

1. *The assembly will vote whether to in principle allow certain congregations in the ELCA to bless the intentions of lifelong, monogamous, same-gender sexual relationships. If this vote passes by over 50%, then they will move to the next vote.*

2. *The assembly will then vote on whether pastors in lifelong, monogamous, same-gender active sexual relationships can in principle serve at approved congregations as rostered leaders in the ELCA. If this vote passes by over 50%, then they will move to the next vote.*

3. *Vote three (I think?) is about finding a way to implement the above two in an atmosphere of “respect,” even while there is disagreement. (I wonder what they mean by “respect” or “having a lack of respect.”) If #3 passes by over 50%, then we will go on to #4.*

4. *Step four paves the way for what is often called “local option.” This means that the above would be implemented only in approved Synods and at congregations that want the above. If this vote receives over 50%, then absurdity will become the ELCA sexuality policy.*

**Pray for our Synod Assembly and other Synod Assemblies that we can change the Churchwide Assembly 50% voting margin for Steps 1-4 to 66%.**

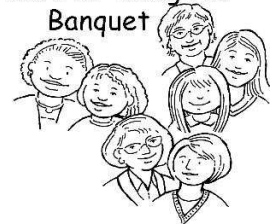

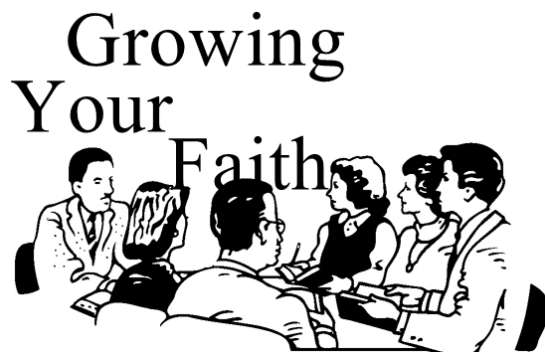

## Introducing Youth Ministry Intern Zach Poulter

As you read in this month's cover article, when June 30 rolls around and Pastor Wendy focuses her time and energy on *Call, Inc.* Hope is left with a void in our staff. The church Council has decided in order to both fill that void and fulfill Hope's mission to help people discern God's call to know, follow, and serve Jesus Christ that we will hire a full-time youth ministry intern. The intern will allow Matt to focus part of his time and energy on Wendy's Ministry Development responsibilities while not neglecting the youth ministry.

To fill this youth ministry internship we have contacted John Brown University, Matt's *alma mater*, and will host Zach Poulter from June-December 2009. As a student at the same university that Matt graduated from, we are familiar with the quality and nature of the education that he has received. Matt completed the same youth ministry internship with a church in Oklahoma when he was a student at JBU.

The internship program at JBU is a very unique program. Almost every Christian university that offers a youth ministry degree requires their graduates to complete a full-time youth ministry internship; however, most of these internships are only for three months during the summer. JBU requires their Youth Ministry majors to complete a seven-month internship during the summer and fall of a student's senior year. There are numerous advantages to such a structure, both to the host church and to the intern.

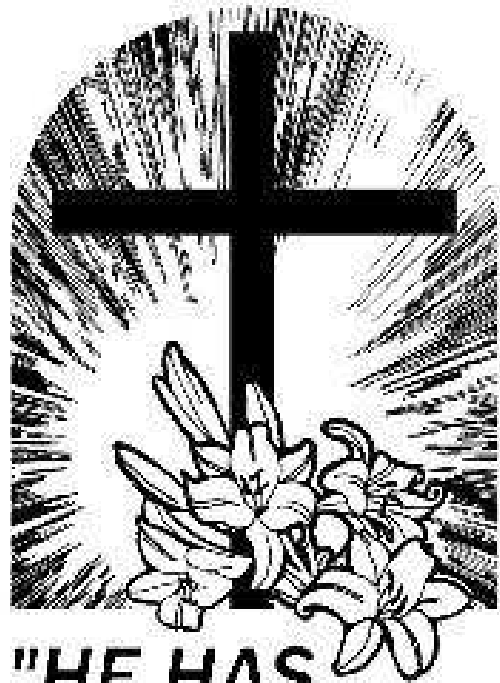
