WORKSHOPS

- 1. Healing through Stories:** Reflecting on and sharing your own life stories and memories can contribute to your physical and spiritual health and healing.
- 2. Fun in the Telling:** This workshop helps you discover your personal stories and how to tell (share) them in a way that entertains and passes on family history and traditions.
- 3. Everyone Has a Story—What’s Yours?:** Using the same techniques we use to tell the stories of our lives, we’ll learn to tell our faith stories.
- 4. Telling the Story of Three Dads:** Our shared stories merge as Craig tells the story of Dick Hoyt and his disabled son, the story of his own dad, and the story of his relationship with his “heavenly Dad.”
- 5. The Shack, the Bible, and Me:** This workshop intersects the stories of Paul Young, Mack (the main character in The Shack), the biblical story, and our personal stories, and suggests ways these lend valuable perspectives to our lives.
- 6. Chasing Your Ancestors:** Telling the story of your ancestors brings their reality to life again; offers tips on finding and using genealogical search resources.
- 7. Reminiscence Writing:** Members of a memoir writing group in Denton will share their stories and give you ideas to get you started in the writing process. Is this memoir writing? Maybe. Fun? Certainly!
- 8. God’s New “Yes” for You:** Through the transitions of growing older, God has significant things for you to do! Helpful insights will be offered for discovering, discerning, and incorporating God’s call for you into this chapter in life.
